The Purpose of C.A.I.

The C.A.I. Project will operate in two different ways. Firstly, C.A.I. will support the fund-raising events of many locally registered charities, by providing quality music groups at their own charity events. An example of this could be a quartet group, Jazz Ensemble, Rock-n-Roll group, Country Western or a choir or full orchestra etc., as appropriate. C.A.I. will apply for local authority funding to do this.

C.A.I. will also raise donations through memberships from the public, which will be held in the C.A.I. Trust fund. As the fund generates interest, this will be used to employ musicians at C.A.I. fund-raising events.

Monies raised will then be split as in the example below:

£1,000 raised at a fund-raising event.

£500 is divided between the charities represented by C.A.I. on a per ratio basis.

£500 would be divided in the same way but through the C.A.I. Trust fund for future fund-raising concerts and for the inclusion of more musicians.

This will enable the C.A.I. Project to help other charities, and will build more funds to generate more interest, and will thus make C.A.I. become self-perpetuating.

Why Support The C.A.I. Project

- C.A.I. supports local charities.

- Concerts may take place in Care Homes and Schools, or other locations in the community, uniting the community with those in care, etc.
- After many C.A.I. concert events there will be a buffet supper for members in attendance.

- Members may place an advertisement subject to suitability and eligibility in C.A.I. Concert Programmes.

- Pay monthly toward the membership level of your choice and the charity/s of your choice. If your favourite charity/s does not appear on the list, please tell us and if that charity meets the necessary criteria of C.A.I. and they will accept donations, they can be added to the list.

- Members may attend as many concert events as they wish.
- Spare time on your hands? Why not see how you can help us.

Advantages

- Information will be available regarding membership donation totals, and the capital funds held in the C.A.I. trust as well.
- You may shift all the capital you have given to date, from one charity to another as you choose, which will affect the percentage of funds the affected charity/s, will have of the total capital, and how much they can collect from future fundraising concert events.
- The interest from your capital donations will continue to generate interest which will hire musicians to fundraise for your chosen charity/s, even long after you are gone.
- Via the C.A.I. website you can keep track of the percentages of the total capital that each charity owns at all times.

- Once you have contributed the total sum of any level, you will be remembered permanently in all future programme guides for your contributions.

A former violin instructor from the Bristol University left 100k to the Cat's Projection League. What a pity the C.A.I. Project did not exist back then, because if it had, that instructor would have had the option of leaving part or all of that to the Cat's Protection League through the C.A.I. Trust. The interest alone from his donation would have provided work for a full orchestra of up to 50 members every year, raising funds from ticket sales to benefit the Cat's Protection League permanently. The Orchestra could have been named after him, and every year he would have been honoured for his contribution to this cause.

The Project

Each charity owns a percentage of the total funds in the C.A.I. Trust, based on contributions by members. If a member would like a particular charity to gain a higher percentage from a fundraising concert event, they can contribute more through their donations to that charity.

Interest received from funds in the C.A.I. Trust will be used to pay musicians to take part in fundraising concert events. This will raise further funding for more concert events and more musicians. C.A.I. would also be raising funds for all the charities listed in the C.A.I. Project.
